Summary (as of Mar 17, 2015)

Promoting Border Commerce and Travel Act

Prohibits the Secretary of Homeland Security from: (1) establishing, collecting, or otherwise imposing a border crossing fee for pedestrians or passenger vehicles at land ports of entry along the southern or northern border of the United States; or (2) conducting any study relating to imposition of such a fee.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 21, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Border Security.
- **Mar 27, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Trade.
- **Mar 17, 2015:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 17, 2015:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
