Balancing Trade Act of 2015

Requires the President, if in three consecutive calendar years the United States has a trade deficit with another country of \$10 billion or more, to take the necessary steps to create a trading relationship that would eliminate or substantially reduce that trade deficit by entering into an agreement with that country.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 19, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Trade.
- **Mar 17, 2015:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 17, 2015:** Referred to the House Committee on Ways and Means.
