Defund Amnesty Act of 2015

This bill prohibits the use of funds appropriated or otherwise made available to implement or enforce specified immigration-related policies in:

- the memoranda issued by the Secretary of Homeland Security on November 20, 2014,
- the memoranda issued by the President on November 21, 2014, and
- any substantially similar memorandum issued after November 21, 2014.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 2, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Border Security.
- **Jan 28, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border and Maritime Security.
- **Jan 6, 2015:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 6, 2015:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Homeland Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
