Summary (as of Apr 16, 2015)

Air Traffic Controller Reform and Employee Stock Ownership Act of 2015

This bill directs the Department of Transportation to transfer Federal Aviation Administration air traffic control personnel and property to a private corporation. The corporation shall issue securities to such personnel giving them stock ownership in the corporation.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 17, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Aviation.
- **Apr 16, 2015:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 16, 2015:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
