To amend the Controlled Substances Import and Export Act to remove regulatory barriers to the re-exportation of controlled substances among members of the European Economic Area.

### Summary (as of May 14, 2015)

Amends the Controlled Substances Import and Export Act to allow exported controlled substances to be re-exported within the European Economic Area.

Prohibits the Attorney General from promulgating or enforcing any regulation, subregulatory guidance, or enforcement policy that impedes such re-exportation among European Economic Area countries.

## **Actions Timeline**

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- **Jun 26, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, Homeland Security, and Investigations.
- **May 15, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **May 14, 2015:** Introduced in House
- **May 14, 2015:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
