## Summary (as of Jun 12, 2015)

### American Worker Mobility Act of 2015

Authorizes the Department of Labor to grant a relocation subsidy of up to \$10,000 to an individual who:

- has been totally unemployed for at least 26 consecutive weeks;
- has exhausted all rights to state or federal unemployment compensation;
- has not received a relocation subsidy for the two-year period preceding the subsidy application; and
- is able to work, available to work, and actively seeking work.

Prescribes subsidy program requirements.

Directs the Department to issue regulations to prevent program fraud or abuse.
