### Summary (as of Apr 11, 2016)

This bill exempts from the requirement that veterans pay a Department of Veterans Affairs copayment for:

- any opioid antagonists furnished to a veteran at high risk for overdose of a specific medication or substance in order to reverse the effect of such an overdose, and
- education on their use.
