## **Commission on Americans Living Abroad Act of 2015**

Establishes the Commission on Americans Living Abroad which shall conduct a study of how federal laws and policies affect U.S. citizens living abroad, including civilians and members of the Armed Forces.

Requires the head of any federal agency that is affected by a recommendation in the report required by this Act to submit a response to the President, Congress, and the Commission.

- **Jul 17, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jul 15, 2015:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 15, 2015:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR E1075)
- **Jul 15, 2015:** Referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, and in addition to the Committees on Financial Services, Ways and Means, the Judiciary, House Administration, and Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
