## **Keep the Promise Act of 2015**

Restricts gaming on land within the Phoenix, Arizona, metropolitan area acquired by the Secretary of the Interior in trust for the benefit of an Indian tribe after April 9, 2013. Terminates the restriction on January 1, 2027.

### **Actions Timeline**

- **Nov 16, 2015:** Mr. Young (AK) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
