Summary (as of Jun 18, 2015)

Recognizes that all Americans should be treated fairly and equally regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity.

Acknowledges the struggle of the Stonewall protestors (human rights protesters at the Stonewall Inn in New York City on June 28, 1969) and other lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ) people for equality.

Encourages the celebration of LGBTQ Pride Month to provide an opportunity for people in the United States to learn about discrimination and inequality that continues to face LGBTQ people.

Recognizes that the United States must continue to strive to ensure that the promise of equality is realized for all Americans.

- **Jul 1, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on the Constitution and Civil Justice.
- **Jun 24, 2015:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR H4643-4645)
- **Jun 18, 2015:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 18, 2015:** Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.
