Summary (as of Sep 9, 2015)

This bill states that Congress favors the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action relating to Iran's nuclear program, signed in Vienna, Austria, on July 14, 2015.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 10, 2015:** Rule H. Res. 412 passed House.
- **Sep 10, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Trade.
- **Sep 10, 2015:** Considered under the provisions of rule H. Res. 412. (consideration: CR H5911-5935; text of measure as introduced: CR H5911)
- **Sep 10, 2015:** Resolution provides for consideration of 3 measures: H. Res. 411; H.R.3460; and H.R. 3461.
- **Sep 10, 2015:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with three hours of debate on H.R. 3461.
- **Sep 10, 2015:** The previous question was ordered pursuant to the rule. (consideration: CR H5935)
- **Sep 10, 2015:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - The Chair put the question on passage of H.R. 3461 and by voice vote announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Royce demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question of passage until a time to be announced.

- **Sep 9, 2015:** Referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and in addition to the Committees on Financial Services, the Judiciary, Oversight and Government Reform, and Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Sep 9, 2015:** Rules Committee Resolution H. Res. 412 Reported to House. Resolution provides for consideration of 3 measures: H. Res. 411; H.R.3460; and H.R. 3461.
