Sets forth the rule for consideration of the bill (H.R. 6) to accelerate the discovery, development, and delivery of 21st century cures.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 9, 2015:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H4976-4985)
- **Jul 9, 2015:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 350.
- **Jul 9, 2015:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 350, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. McGovern demanded the yeas and nays, and the Chair postponed further proceedings on ordering the previous question until later in the legislative day.
