Summary (as of Sep 17, 2015)

Safe Roads Act of 2015

This bill directs the Department of Transportation to prescribe minimum motor vehicle safety standards requiring commercial motor vehicles to be equipped with a forward collision avoidance and mitigation braking system.

The term "forward collision avoidance and mitigation braking system" means a system on a motor vehicle that:

- alerts the driver of an obstacle; and
- if necessary to avoid or mitigate a collision with the obstacle, automatically applies the vehicle's brakes.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 18, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Highways and Transit.
- **Sep 18, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Commerce, Manufacturing, and Trade.
- **Sep 17, 2015:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 17, 2015:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
