Summary (as of Jul 9, 2015)

Requires the Speaker of the House of Representatives to: (1) remove any state flag containing any portion of the Confederate battle flag, other than a flag displayed by the office of a Member of the House, from any area within the House wing of the Capitol or any House office building; and (2) donate any such flag to the Library of Congress.

- **Jul 9, 2015:** Referred to the House Committee on House Administration.
- **Jul 9, 2015:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H4974-4976; text of measure as introduced: CR H4975)
- **Jul 9, 2015:** Mr. McCarthy moved to refer to House Administration. (consideration: CR H4975)
- **Jul 9, 2015:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on the McCarthy motion to refer H.Res. 355 to the Committee on House Administration.
- **Jul 9, 2015:** The previous question on the motion to refer Agreed to by recorded vote: 238 - 185 (Roll No. 425). (consideration: CR H4975)
- **Jul 9, 2015:** On motion to refer Agreed to by recorded vote: 238 - 176 (Roll No. 426).
- **Jul 9, 2015:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
