Medical Preparedness Allowable Use Act

Amends the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to authorize the use of Urban Area Security Initiative and State Homeland Security Grant Program funding for enhancing medical preparedness, medical surge capacity, and mass prophylaxis capabilities, including the development and maintenance of an initial pharmaceutical stockpile, including medical kits, and diagnostics sufficient to protect first responders, their families, immediate victims, and vulnerable populations from a chemical or biological event.

- **Feb 3, 2015:** Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.
- **Feb 2, 2015:** Mr. Carter (GA) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Feb 2, 2015:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H675-677)
- **Feb 2, 2015:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 361.
- **Feb 2, 2015:** At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
