Summary (as of Nov 19, 2015)

This bill requires the Government Accountability Office to evaluate the feasibility of modifying the five-month waiting period for certain individuals entitled to disability insurance benefits by:

- shortening the waiting period for individuals with more severe disabilities or lower annual household income, and
- shortening or eliminating the waiting period for individuals with a terminal illness.
