Summary (as of Jan 13, 2016)

Veterans Administration Bonus Elimination Act of 2016

This bill amends the Veterans Access, Choice, and Accountability Act of 2014 to deny certain awards or bonuses to senior executive employees of the Veterans Health Administration who fail to satisfy requests for Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) hospital or medical services within the VA's wait-time goals or within the time line specified by the requesting individual, whichever is later.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 13, 2016:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 13, 2016:** Referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Jan 13, 2016:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Opportunity.

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
