Promoting Women in Entrepreneurship Act

(Sec. 3) This bill amends the Science and Engineering Equal Opportunities Act to authorize the National Science Foundation to encourage its entrepreneurial programs to recruit and support women to extend their focus beyond the laboratory and into the commercial world.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 26, 2016:** Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation. Reported by Senator Thune without amendment. Without written report.
- **Sep 26, 2016:** Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders. Calendar No. 643.
- **Sep 21, 2016:** Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation. Ordered to be reported without amendment favorably.
- **Apr 4, 2016:** Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation.
- **Mar 22, 2016:** Mrs. Comstock moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Mar 22, 2016:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H1514-1516)
- **Mar 22, 2016:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 4742.
- **Mar 22, 2016:** At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
