Summary (as of Dec 8, 2015)

Sets forth the rule for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2130) to provide legal certainty to property owners along the Red River in Texas, and for other purposes, and providing for consideration of motions to suspend the rules.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 9, 2015:** By direction of the Committee on Rules, Mr. Newhouse called up H.Res. 556 and asked for its immediate consideration.
- **Dec 9, 2015:** POINT OF ORDER - Ms. Esty raised a point of order against the provisions of H.Res. 556 on the grounds that the resolution violates the Congressional Budget Act. The Chair announced that the disposition of the point of order would be resolved by the question of consideration of H.Res. 556. The House proceeded with 20 minutes of debate on the point of order at the end of which the Chair will put the question on consideration.
- **Dec 9, 2015:** On consideration of the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 241 - 174 (Roll no. 681).
- **Dec 9, 2015:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H9092-9104)
- **Dec 9, 2015:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 556.
- **Dec 9, 2015:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 242 - 178 (Roll no. 682). (consideration: CR H9102-9104; text: CR H9102-9103)
- **Dec 9, 2015:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 241 - 183 (Roll no. 683).(text: CR H9093)
- **Dec 9, 2015:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 241 - 183 (Roll no. 683). (text: CR H9093)
- **Dec 9, 2015:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Dec 8, 2015:** Introduced in House
- **Dec 8, 2015:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 114-375, by Mr. Newhouse.
- **Dec 8, 2015:** Rule provides for consideration of H.R. 2130 with 1 hour of general debate. Previous question shall be considered as ordered without intervening motions except motion to recommit with or without instructions. Measure will be considered read. Specified amendments are in order.
- **Dec 8, 2015:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 79.
