Modernizing Travel to the Marianas Act of 2016

This bill amends the Immigration and Nationality Act to direct the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to develop and implement a fully automated electronic travel authorization system to collect biographical and other information in order to determine, before travel, the eligibility of, and any law enforcement or security risk of permitting, an alien to travel to Guam or the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

DHS shall establish and collect a fee for the use of such system.

Such system shall be similar to the electronic system for travel authorization to the United States.

- **Aug 2, 2016:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border and Maritime Security.
- **Jul 14, 2016:** Introduced in House

- **Jul 14, 2016:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Homeland Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
