- in the Supreme Court in the matter of *United States, et al. v. Texas, et al.*, No. 15-674, supports the position of the petitioners; and
- supports the position stated in a specified amicus brief filed on March 8, 2016, on behalf of 186 Democratic House Members and 39 Democratic Senators in support of the Obama Administration's position in *United States, et al. v. Texas, et al.*, namely, that the Administration's immigration executive actions are authorized by existing laws enacted by Congress and are consistent with actions taken by both Democratic and Republican presidents since the Eisenhower Administration.
