Summary (as of Nov 18, 2015)

Declares that, in the case of a governor requesting that Syrian refugees not be resettled in his or her state (whether temporarily or permanently), no federal official should take any adverse action against, or withhold funds from, the state, and no federal official should take any other action to persuade or entice the governor to reverse such request.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 4, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Border Security.
- **Nov 18, 2015:** Introduced in House
- **Nov 18, 2015:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
