Summary (as of Feb 13, 2015)

Veterans Air Travel Streamlining Act of 2015

Requires: (1) the Administrator of the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) to waive the application fee for veterans with a service-connected disability rated at 50% or more who apply to participate in TSA's Pre-check program, and (2) the Administrator and the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to establish a system to verify such a veteran's disability rating and whether such veteran's disability is service-connected.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 12, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Transportation Security.
- **Mar 6, 2015:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs.
- **Feb 13, 2015:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 13, 2015:** Referred to the Committee on Homeland Security, and in addition to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
