- **Jul 24, 2018:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 1011.
- **Jul 24, 2018:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 1011, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote, announced the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Hastings demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on ordering the previous question on H. Res. 1011 until later in the legislative day.
- **Jul 24, 2018:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 223 - 188 (Roll no. 370). (consideration: CR H7095)
- **Jul 24, 2018:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 225 - 184 (Roll no. 371).(text: CR H7095)
- **Jul 24, 2018:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 225 - 184 (Roll no. 371). (text: CR H7095)
