- **Sep 26, 2018:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H.Res. 1071, the Chair put the question on agreeing to the resolution, and by voice vote, announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Goodlatte demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on agreeing to the resolution until a time to be announced.
