Summary (as of Feb 5, 2018)

Reinforcing American-Made Products Act of 2017

This bill amends the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 to specify that the Federal Trade Commission's regulation of the labeling of products as "Made in the U.S.A." or "Made in America" supersedes any conflicting state laws.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 5, 2018:** Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders. Calendar No. 297.
- **May 18, 2017:** Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation. Ordered to be reported with an amendment in the nature of a substitute favorably.
- **Jan 12, 2017:** Introduced in Senate
- **Jan 12, 2017:** Read twice and referred to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation.
