Summary (as of Jan 3, 2017)

Corporate Crime Database Act

This bill directs the Department of Justice (DOJ) to acquire data regarding federal and state administrative, civil, and criminal proceedings initiated or concluded during each calendar year against any corporation or its acting officials involving a criminal or civil charge with a potential fine of \$1,000 or more.

DOJ must establish and maintain a public database of information regarding misconduct by corporations with annual revenues greater than \$1 billion. The database must include information about each such federal and state proceeding with a potential fine of \$1,000 or more.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 23, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, Homeland Security, and Investigations.
- **Jan 3, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 3, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
