Summary (as of Dec 21, 2018)

(Sec. 1) This bill directs the Department of Energy to update its report on the energy and environmental benefits of re-refining used lubricating oil and submit to Congress a strategic plan to increase the beneficial reuse of lubricating oil.

The strategic plan shall address measures needed to (1) increase the responsible collection of used oil; (2) disseminate public information concerning sustainable reuse options for used oil; and (3) promote sustainable reuse of used oil by federal agencies, recipients of federal grant funds, entities contracting with the federal government, and the general public.
