Summary (as of Apr 27, 2017)

Tennessee Wilderness Act of 2017

This bill designates specified federal lands in Cherokee National Forest in Tennessee as wilderness and as additions to existing components of the National Wilderness Preservation System.

Actions Timeline

- **May 19, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Conservation and Forestry.
- **May 16, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Federal Lands.
- **Apr 27, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 27, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on Agriculture, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
