Summary (as of May 24, 2017)

Renew Act of 2017

This bill amends the federal criminal code to modify expungement eligibility criteria for certain first-time drug offenders.

Specifically, it broadens eligibility to allow the expungement of certain records related to a first-time drug possession offense committed before age 25 (currently, before age 21).

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 26, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, Homeland Security, and Investigations.
- **May 24, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **May 24, 2017:** Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.
