United States Citizenship and Immigration Services Authorization Act

This bill amends the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to: (1) establish, by statute, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services within the Department of Homeland Security; and (2) remove references to the Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 12, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Border Security.
- **Jun 15, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border and Maritime Security.
- **May 26, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **May 26, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Homeland Security, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
