Support Startup Businesses Act of 2017

This bill revises requirements governing the Small Business Innovation Research Program and the Small Business Technology Transfer Program, including by expanding the programs to include specified business-assistance services for small businesses and increasing the amount of awards for projects under the programs.

Actions Timeline

- **May 22, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Research and Technology.
- **Jun 6, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 6, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Small Business, and in addition to the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
