Using Data to Prevent Opioid Diversion Act of 2018

This bill establishes a new requirement intended to help drug manufacturers and distributors identify and prevent suspicious orders of opioids and reduce rates of diversion.

Specifically, the Drug Enforcement Administration must use its automated data system—the Automated Reports and Consolidated Ordering System—to inform drug manufacturers and distributors about the quantity and type of opioids that are distributed to pharmacies and practitioners.

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 19, 2018:** Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders. Calendar No. 476.
- **May 24, 2018:** Committee on the Judiciary. Ordered to be reported with an amendment favorably.
- **May 15, 2018:** Introduced in Senate
- **May 15, 2018:** Read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary. (Sponsor introductory remarks on measure: CR S2680-2681)
