Summary (as of Jun 15, 2017)

United States-Israel Anti-Tunnel Defense Cooperation Act

This bill authorizes the Department of Defense, upon request of the Ministry of Defense of Israel and in consultation with the Department of State and the Director of National Intelligence, to carry out research, development, test, and evaluation, on a joint basis with Israel, to establish anti-tunneling capabilities to detect, map, and neutralize underground tunnels that threaten the United States or Israel.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 17, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Emerging Threats and Capabilities.
- **Jun 15, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 15, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
