Summary (as of Jun 21, 2017)

No Carve Out for Congress Act of 2017

This bill amends the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act to modify health insurance plan options for Members of Congress elected from a state that receives a federal waiver of essential health benefits under the American Health Care Act of 2017, if that bill is enacted. Such Members shall not be eligible for government health plans and shall be eligible only for health insurance coverage with the lowest actuarial value (which is the plan that has the enrollee pay the highest percentage of cost sharing) in the individual market of that state.

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 23, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jun 21, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 21, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on House Administration, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
