Summary (as of Jun 23, 2017)

This bill allows a Medicare Advantage (MA) plan to provide certain supplemental benefits to chronically ill enrollees beginning in plan year 2020.

The Government Accountability Office must report to Congress on the provision of such supplemental benefits to MA enrollees.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 5, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jun 30, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jun 23, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 23, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
