Summary (as of Jun 11, 2018)

Opportunities to Provide for Illicit Opioid Interdiction and Detection Act of 2018 or the OPIOID Act of 2018

This bill requires the Department of Homeland Security and the U.S. Customs and Border Protection to jointly develop technology to (1) screen mail, items, and containers entering the United States for narcotic drugs; and (2) screen motor vehicles, pedestrian traffic, and cargo entering the United States at a land border port of entry for narcotic drugs.

Actions Timeline

- **Nov 13, 2018:** Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs. Reported by Senator Johnson with an amendment in the nature of a substitute and an amendment to the title. With written report No. 115-353.
- **Nov 13, 2018:** Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders. Calendar No. 640.
- **Jun 13, 2018:** Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs. Ordered to be reported with an amendment in the nature of a substitute favorably.
- **Jun 11, 2018:** Introduced in Senate
- **Jun 11, 2018:** Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.
