Summary (as of Jul 14, 2017)

Hold Congress Accountable on Healthcare Act

This bill makes Members of Congress ineligible for health plans offered through health insurance exchanges, health plans under the Federal Employees Health Benefit Program, federal health care programs, and federal health coverage subsidies if legislation is enacted that changes the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and increases the rate of individuals without health coverage.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 28, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jul 14, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 14, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on House Administration, and in addition to the Committees on Oversight and Government Reform, Energy and Commerce, and Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
