### Summary (as of Jul 24, 2017)

#### License Natural Gas Now Act of 2017 or the LNG Now Act of 2017

This bill amends the Natural Gas Act to prohibit the federal government from imposing any restriction on the importation and exportation of natural gas.

The bill does not limit the President's ability to restrict the importation or exportation of natural gas: (1) during national emergencies or disasters, and (2) to foreign countries if the President declares a national emergency with respect to such country.

- **Sep 5, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Terrorism, Nonproliferation, and Trade.
- **Jul 28, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Energy.
- **Jul 24, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 24, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
