- **Jun 12, 2017:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 115-178, by Mr. Cole.
- **Jun 12, 2017:** Rule provides for consideration of H.R. 2372 and H.R. 2579, with 1 hour of general debate for each bill. Previous question shall be considered as ordered without intervening motions except a motion to recommit with or without instructions on each bill. Both measures will be considered read and are closed to amendments.
- **Jun 12, 2017:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 56.

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
