Summary (as of Sep 18, 2017)

Personal Data Notification and Protection Act of 2017

This bill requires certain businesses that use, access, transmit, store, dispose of, or collect sensitive personally identifiable information to notify individuals whose information is believed to have been accessed or acquired through a discovered security breach. In addition, the businesses must meet specified requirements for notifying certain federal agencies, credit reporting agencies, and the media regarding a security breach. The bill also sets forth requirements for the notification process, exemptions from the requirements, and enforcement authorities for the Federal Trade Commission and the states.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 22, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Digital Commerce and Consumer Protection.
- **Sep 18, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 18, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
