## Summary (as of Oct 6, 2017)

### Expanded Access to Opioid Abuse Treatment Act of 2017

This bill amends the Controlled Substances Act to allow a pharmacist who meets specified criteria to be a qualifying practitioner who may administer, dispense, or prescribe narcotic drugs for maintenance or detoxification treatment in an office-based opioid treatment program.

## Actions Timeline

- **Oct 16, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, Homeland Security, and Investigations.
- **Oct 13, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Oct 6, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Oct 6, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
