Ensuring Regulations are Successful or Ended Act of 2017 or the ERASE Act of 2017

This bill terminates a federal rule one year after it is finalized unless Congress enacts a joint resolution that provides for the continuance of the rule, or the rule is finalized before the enactment of this bill.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 13, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Regulatory Reform, Commercial And Antitrust Law.
- **Nov 7, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Nov 7, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
