Fair Access to Insurance for Retired (FAIR) Heroes Act of 2017

This bill permits a veteran who is disability-retired for a condition or injury incurred during service in the U.S. Armed Forces to choose health care coverage through Medicare or TRICARE. (TRICARE is a Department of Defense managed health care program for uniformed service members, military retirees, and their dependents.)

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 13, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Military Personnel.
- **Dec 8, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Dec 6, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Dec 6, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the Committees on Energy and Commerce, and Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.

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
