Preventing Iranian Destabilization of Iraq Act of 2017

This bill imposes property-blocking and U.S. entry/visa sanctions until January 1, 2022, against any foreign person or entity that:

- has knowingly committed, or poses a significant risk of committing, violence that threatens Iraq's stability or that undermines its economic reconstruction and political reform;
- has knowingly assisted, or provided financial, material, or technological support for any such activity; or
- is owned or controlled by, or has acted on behalf of, a foreign person that has carried out any such activity.

Actions Timeline

- **Nov 28, 2018:** Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations.
- **Nov 27, 2018:** Mr. Royce (CA) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill, as amended.
- **Nov 27, 2018:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H9593-9594)
- **Nov 27, 2018:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 4591.
- **Nov 27, 2018:** Passed/agreed to in House: On motion to suspend the rules and pass the bill, as amended Agreed to by voice vote.(text: CR H9593-9597)
- **Nov 27, 2018:** On motion to suspend the rules and pass the bill, as amended Agreed to by voice vote. (text: CR H9593-9597)
