Repeal Insurance Plans of the Multi-State Program Act of 2017 or the RIP MSP Act

This bill repeals a provision of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act that allows the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) to enter into contracts with health insurance issuers to offer multi-state plan options.

OPM must report about specified efforts in its process to wind down the multi-state program.

The bill rescinds specified unobligated funds that were provided to OPM for staffing and administering the multi-state program.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 22, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Dec 15, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Dec 15, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Appropriations, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
