Summary (as of Jan 3, 2018)

Gold King Mine Spill Accountability Act of 2018

This bill provides assistance to persons injured by the Gold King Mine spill in Colorado that released mine wastewater laced with heavy metals into the Animas and San Juan Rivers. The bill states that a person may include an individual; a tribal organization; a nonfederal entity; states; or the Animas-La Plata Operation, Maintenance, and Replacement Association.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 5, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Environment.
- **Jan 4, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment.
- **Jan 3, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 3, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committees on the Judiciary, Energy and Commerce, and Agriculture, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
