Change Order Transparency for Federal Contractors Act

This bill amends the Small Business Act to require an agency, with respect to solicitations for the award of a construction contract anticipated to be awarded to a small business, to provide a notice to the prospective bidders and offerors along with the solicitation about the agency's: (1) policies or practices relating to the timely definitization of requests for an equitable adjustment, and (2) past performance in definitizing such requests.

- **May 8, 2018:** Mr. Chabot moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **May 8, 2018:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H3800-3801)
- **May 8, 2018:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 4754.
- **May 8, 2018:** Passed/agreed to in House: On motion to suspend the rules and pass the bill Agreed to by voice vote.(text: CR H3800)
