Streamlining and Expediting Approval for Communications Technologies Act

This bill directs Senior Real Property Officers of specified federal agencies to track applications to locate or modify communications facilities on certain federal real property assets of those agencies.

Each officer shall report on the tracking of such applications to the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA). In turn, the NTIA shall report to Congress on the information in each submitted report and analyses of the application process.

An officer must respond to an inquiry about the status of an application from the applicant no later than seven days after receiving such inquiry.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 19, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Communications and Technology.
- **Jan 17, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings and Emergency Management.
- **Jan 16, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 16, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committees on Oversight and Government Reform, and Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
