Summary (as of Jan 18, 2018)

Broadband Infrastructure Inventory Act of 2018

This bill requires the Department of Commerce to establish and maintain an inventory of federal real property or federal interest in real property on which a communications facility could be constructed or that is suitable for deployment of communications facilities or services. Commerce must make the inventory available to any entity that constructs or operates communications facilities or provides communications services.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 19, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings and Emergency Management.
- **Jan 19, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Communications and Technology.
- **Jan 18, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 18, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
